NATIONAL DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE Mr. Simon Kande

The student movement has had a rich legacy of impact through many centuries across the globe. The impact has ranged from localized revivals to the raising of cross-cultural missionaries. One of the key highlights of the student movement can be traced back to the Moravian revival that not only transformed the locality that the Moravians occupied but went ahead to transform the world through the sending out of missionaries to the world. It is documented that this group of Christians were the very first protestant group to send out missionaries. We must note that one of the key figures Count Zinzendorf, interacted with the Moravians while still a student. Despite his love for theology and the gospel, his familial duties tended to act as a derailment but not forever.

Zinzendorf would later reconnect with the Moravians and they would together be agents of revival and missions to the world. This revival started with the call to prayer. Zinzendorf and the Moravians started a prayer chain that went on to last for 100 years as committed brothers and sisters laboured in prayer, praying for God to increase labourers, cause his gospel to be known across the world and help them live lives that honour him. God, would end up answering these prayers by causing them to have the heart to Go and reach out to the nations.

Hearing of such powerful impactful stories, we cannot help but desire to witness the birth of bigger movements that heed the call of Jesus Christ to take the Gospel to all parts of the world. FOCUS Kenya, exists to reach students and change nations. One of the ways that this happens is through the organisation of Conferences such as the Commission Conference that aims to mobilise Christian students

and graduates for missions. With over 52,000 Christian students being served by FOCUS across Kenya, we believe that Commission conference can serve as a great platform to mobilise these students to be part of the mission of God in every area that they are in.

Commission 2021 being our 11th Missions conference since its inception in 1988, it uniqueness lies in the fact that it is a virtual conference owing to the dynamics cause by COVID 19 Pandemic. For the last 33 years, the Lord has used Commission to radically transform the lives of more than 20,400 delegates and to call them to their vocations through which the gospel has been proclaimed to all the nations. As we virtually meet on this conference from different countries of the world, we shall be exploring what it means for each of us in our contexts to respond to the words of Jesus 'As the Father has sent me, so I send you.- John 20:21' This being the running motto for the Commission Conferences, it offers a clarion and ongoing call to all delegates in successive generations to faithfully take heed and

obey the Master's call..

Despite the difficulties caused by the pandemic, God opened our eyes to the opportunities of sharing the gospel amidst such difficulties. God's voice was clear that we needed to focus on the Gospel in three distinct ways which form the thrust of this conference: *The Content of the Gospel, The Carriers of the Gospel and The Context of the Gospel.* This year the Lord led us to gather together to study the book of Luke. The program content has been developed through prior study of the book of Luke with colleagues and other partners and the Holy Spirit put it in our hearts from the text that even in such a time, the Gospel must keep transforming this dynamic world. Therefore, the theme for this conference is *"The Gospel Transforming a dynamic World."*

Being a virtual conference, the content has been designed to run for short sessions for the 14 days. This content is divided into six (6) main areas: **3 Bible expositions from the book of Luke; a 22day Luke challenge devotional for personal study; 7 plenary sessions; 3 missions' panels, 45 seminar sessions over 5 days and continuous prayer engagement.** There will be interactive sessions with speakers/missionary partners after the main sessions and a Commitment forum on the last day.

Our prayer is that you will encounter the power of God in this conference. In His divine way, God will clarify your purpose and call to share the gospel with the world around you and beyond. Keep your eyes, ears and heart open to the message of God in every session. God is at work in the world and we therefore need to join Him in His global mission of transforming the world. Blessings galore!





The first ever FOCUS missions convention was held in 1985 at Rift Valley Institute of Science and Technology (RVIST). Out of this convention, the need for creating a well-coordinated regional forum for missions' awareness, both for mobilization, information sharing, networking and involvement by students, graduates (associates) and churches was born. Theological training was then seen as belonging to those who did not succeed well enough in their secondary education to join more prestigious tertiary institutions. There were few Christians reflecting biblically on African problems, there were hardly any indigenous mission agencies, and giving towards missions was minimal.

On the other hand, there was the reality of the strategic role of students in world missions as agents of change. As David Howard has rightly observed, "when students decide to act, things happen. That is the history of mission. For the missionary movement has a tremendous vitality often sparked by students with a worldwide vision." Throughout history, students have played a critical role in missions whether as career missionaries or through their different professions. It is the above scenario that led FOCUS Kenya to think of a well-coordinated national forum for creating missions awareness, in order to facilitate



mobilization and challenge participants towards mission involvement within and without our context, hence the 'birthing' of Commission Conference(s).

Though Commission initially targeted the then

three East African countries (Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania), it has since taken a continental and indeed an international outlook with the last five Commissions (2004, 2008, 2011, 2014 & 2017) having representation from 26, 18, 17 and 13 nationalities respectively. We can only attribute this phenomenal growth to God. We believe, as many other Christians do, that God is a missionary God, and therefore He is the primary actor in moving and expanding His work as long as His people are willing, obedient and cooperative with His leading and prompting.

The name 'Commission' was (and still is) preferred because it points to reflect the Great Commission that the Lord Jesus Christ gave to his disciples in Matthew 28:19.



HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF COMMISSION 2021



Commission 2021 is a virtual conference which unlike physical conferences, you will not enjoy physical interactions. However, this does not mean that you cannot reap the full benefits of such a conference virtually. Here are a few ideas:

- Stable and efficient gadget: Get the most reliable gadget with good sound, internet connectivity and power to last you through each session. Get good data bundle packages to run through a session.
- **2. Surrounding environment:** Find a comfortable place to sit away, from distractions. This will help you concentrate through the sessions.
- 3. 22-day Luke Challenge: Starting 1st November, start your day by going through the daily portion of the Luke devotional guide. This is to help you take a reflective missions journey through the book of Luke. Get a friend or someone closest to you to discuss this with.
- **4. Seminars:** These will run on 1st, 3rd, 5th, 8th and 10th November from 7.30pm 9:00pm (EAT). With a list of 8 -10 seminars to choose from, take time to go through the

synopsis of each and choose the one that gives you the best opportunity to learn. Arm yourself with questions to ask the speaker at the end of the session.

- 5. Plenary sessions/Panels: Log-in at least 5 minutes before the session begins – ensures you sort any technical issues before the session begins. Where possible, you can join up with other registered delegates and listen in as a group. This kills the digital fatigue and gives you a chance to share your reflections after the session. Interact with the synopsis beforehand and get ready for the session.
- 6. Interactive sessions: Make use of the interactive rooms provided to network and meet missions' partners, speakers, other CU members and associates.
- Reflection and prayer: After every session, take time to ponder on the lessons learnt, write on your journal any reflections and commitments. Take time to respond in prayer to God.
- 8. Engage with others: As you learn and enjoy the conference, take time to share with your friends, family, roommates, etc. This will include sharing knowledge with the Christians or the gospel with non-Christians.





This challenged dubbed, 'The Luke 22 days challenge,' is part of the Virtual Commission 2021 Conference. It is meant to be part of the tripartite missional Scripture engagement program which include seminars and Bible exposition on the book of Luke. As such, the material to facilitate it is in the format of a hybrid between devotional and Bible study.

The challenge is largely meant to run virtually both on the Fellowship of Christian Unions (FOCUS) Kenya website and mobile phone application. However, individuals and groups of various categories of delegates are allowed to creatively go through the challenge in small groups where possible. It is also important to note that this challenge will be a synchrony to Bible exposition sessions as schedule. Because of this, every delegate will be required to participate in it.

In terms of the format, the 'Luke 22 days challenge,' will have four parts; Scriptural text portion for the day, brief introductory devotional writeup on the Scriptural text for the day, two reflection questions, and a take home. The Scriptural text portion for the day shall be a selected anchor text for the day from the book of Luke. This Scriptural text will be available on the FOCUS Kenya mobile app and Commission website. For the devotional writeup on the Scriptural text, the focus will be on a summary of the Bible teaching within that passage, drawing the person using the material to the main points of the passage(s) of study for that day. Reflection questions shall however, focus on the context analysis of the passage (text context and the readers' context -current context) and the key application point of that study. For the take home part, the focus shall be on practical action suggestions for individuals beyond the Study. It shall also provide broader contexts for application of the study. It is our hope that this program will be a platform for each delegate to engage God through His word for transformative missional living.

Odede has travelled to many countries conducting Bible Exposition and leadership training, and has been a featured speaker at numerous conferences and missions conventions, including being a Bible expositor at the Lausanne III Congress, Capetown 2010, Keswick Convention (UK), New Horizon (Northern Ireland) and Urbana Missions Convention (USA), among many others. Calisto and his wife, Elizabeth, have three sons: Victor, Benson and Michael.

CFM PROGRAMS

1. Kingdom Eye Training

This is a training and Mobilization tool for empowering the Church and individuals to be passionate on missions to the unreached and Muslims people. The course will help Christians to respond spiritually, socially, economically and politically to the growth of other faiths. It has 15 lessons, offered for 5 days at a cost of 3,500/= per person. Food and accommodation excluded. It can either be done physically and virtually.

2. Christmas Child Program

Christmas Child program aims on giving a smile to vulnerable & marginalized children in North Eastern, Tana River, Sosoma in Kitui county and Witeremere slums in Nyeri County during Christmas. The program intends to make 1,500 children from these areas smile during Christmas celebrations, they are given gifts worth 2,500 per child that include a Bible, a school bag, stationary, solar lamp, lunch box and motivational books especially for teens. They also play games, watch a film and share a meal.

3. Mission Conference

CFM together with some partners are planning for a mission conference in 2021, the four tier Conference will target the denominational Church Leaders, Senior leaders. Professionals Church and Business persons. and Missions champions. The conference intends to share results of a research carried out on growth of other faiths and the Church response.

4. Daniel Field Training Program

Daniel training is a mission field training program targeting the professionals and business people living and working among the unreached people groups. The aim of project Daniel is to empower and capacity build the professionals and business people with skills and strategies to reach the unreached people groups and Muslims in their circles.



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
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COMMISSION 2021 FOLLOW UP PLAN

As it is with all commission conferences, Commission 2021 aims at *preserving on-going mission awareness, responsiveness and involvement among Christian students, graduates at the marketplace and church members guided by*, John 20:21. Commission 2021 will be a platform that will see the delegates mobilized and equipped for missions. It is expected that during the conference, the delegates will:

 Hear God's word and develop a deep passion for the lost world
 Hear God's call to specific areas of mission and make a written commitment to be involved after the conference
 Get exposed to a diverse range of mission opportunities and will thus commit time, money, prayers and other resources towards missions
 Network with various missions' agencies and practitioners for mentorship and involvement after the conference.
 Desire to undertake further training, academic or otherwise, in the area of missions.

Commission 2021 follow up is a plan to keep you reminded of the lessons, networks and commitments that you will make during this conference. In order to do this, the Commission planning team has put the following plans in place:

- 1. Commitment form: A commitment form has been prepared for you to write what you're feeling God leading you to during this conference. Click on the link prepared and fill out the details. After the conference, the follow up team will write to you regarding your commitment periodically.
- 2. Evangelistic bible study guide: An EBS guide will be launched during the conference and offered to the delegates as a tool to enable you reach out to those closest to you with the gospel. Make a point of accessing this on the FOCUS Kenya app available on the Google playstore.

- 5. Opportunities for missions': The follow up team will seek opportunities

for involvement among the commission partners. Such opportunities will be availed to all the delegates for consideration. You can link with such partners in the conference via the adverts in this booklet or during interactive sessions. FOCUS Kenya will launch a short term cross-cultural missions program to enable at least 50 students to participate annually.

- 6. Further training: Commission 2021 will be a start of capacity building in missions. After the conference, there will be available opportunities for students, graduates and church members in the areas of Muslim evangelism, digital evangelism, cross-cultural missions, missions' mobilization, public theology and many more. Some of these will be organized by FOCUS Kenya, while others will be through partnership with the existing partners.
- 7. Bible study: The 22-Luke Challenge is designed in such a way that it will continue after the conference. Make it your devotional guide for the month of November. At the start of 2022, FOCUS Kenya will be working on a missions bible study guide based on the book of Luke. Be on the look-out for it and adopt it as a commission follow up material for you CU, church group, home cell or bible study group.
