- (vii) tracking patient progress while maintaining comprehensive treatment records and implementing changes to therapy programs as required to provide better;
- (viii) liaise with other professional's e. nurses, surgeons, physiotherapists, occupational therapists and care givers to design a model intervention plan according to individual patient needs; and
