Carpal Tunnel Syndrome



Median nerve 'entrapment neuropathy' caused by compression of the median nerve in the carpal tunnel.

Clinical features

- Intermittent paresthesia, pain/burning and numbness of thumb, first, middle and radial half of ring finger
- Loss of strength and wasting of the thenar eminence
- Symptoms often worse at night
- Phalen's sign +ve
- Tinnel's test +ve

Causes

- Idiopathic
- Pregnancy
- Obesity
- Local extrinsic pressure e.g. ganglion, lipoma
- Endocrine causes
 - Diabetes
 - o Hypothyroidism
 - o Acromegaly

Differentials

- Thoracic outlet syndrome
- Pronator syndrome

Management

Spontaneous resolution occurs in 25% over 1 year

- Conservative
 - Watch and wait
 - Wrist splint (especially at night)
 - Steroid injection (used rarely)
 - o NSAIDs may help
- Surgery
 - o Carpal tunnel release (cut ligament over front of wrist under local anaesthesia) recurrence rare
