Drugs and Renal Failure



Drugs causing renal failure

- Interstitial nephritis
 - o NSAIDs
 - Antibiotics
- Acute tubular necrosis
 - o Lithium
 - o Contrast
 - o Gentamycin
- Precipitate renal artery stenosis
 - ACE inhibitors
- Glomerular damage
 - o Gold
 - NSAIDs

NB. these should all also be avoided in renal failure

Drugs contraindicated in renal failure

Mnemonic: Many People Like To Nap Naked

Metformin
Potassium-sparring diuretics
Lithium
Tetracyclines
Nitrofurantoin
NSAIDs (caution)

Drugs which accumulate in renal failure

Many antibiotics (closely monitor and decrease dose frequency) LMWH (give half dose or unfractionated heparin) Opioids Digoxin Atenolol Methotrexate Sulfonylureas

Drugs which need a higher dose renal failure
