 - Usually found in slum areas, where children are in close proximity to each other, in small rooms, minimal ventilation
- Bradford Hill Criteria
- Measures of association
 - Compare and contrast odds ratio and relative risk with reference to one of the NCDs
 - Why do you think attributable risk is an important measure
- Life course approach to social determinants of health
 - Life course perspective has 2 models
 - Cumulative of risk model - postulates that we collect risk factors incrementally from the time you are conceived in the uterus onwards through life till you have "sufficient" risks to develop a disease outcome.
 - Critical point model - postulates that there is a point at which, if you have been exposed to prior risk factors, after this point, any exposure will trigger the risk factor. This is the critical point.
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
